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PROPOSED FEE SCHEDULE CHANGES

The State of CT's change in 2018 to the FDA Food Code will result in changing food service establishments from the current categories of Class I-Class IV to FDA1-FDA4. Although there will be less routine inspections required for some of the food service establishments, we will be reviewing and approving more exceptions and special processes, which over time, will result in increased inspection time. The fees will not change for most food service establishments aside from Class 1's, but their classification will.

Rationale: This process is quite involved-menu must be reviewed, detailed walk-through and evaluation of what items need upgrading along with scheduling a timeframe for the upgrades.

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Late Fee for Annual License-\$400.00

Align with license fee \$150-\$400.00

Rationale: The current fee is extremely high for those who pay lower amounts for their licenses.

Proposed:

For Food Service Establishments that initiate their license after May 1 (within 6 months of the license renewal date), that food service establishment will be charged one-half (50%) of the annual fee.

Temporary Food Event Fees:

Proposed:

To encourage new community events, the Health District will charge 50% of the established fees for each vendor for a first-time event. (Health District will determine if the event is a new event)

For vendors that have a licensed base of operations and want to participate in multiple temporary events in the community, the Health District will charge an annual fee of \$300.00. The vendors would be reviewed one time and would need to maintain the same menu and could receive multiple temporary food licenses throughout the year. We will create a list of these vendors to facilitate event coordinators in planning their events.

Farmers' Markets:

Proposed:

Any vendor who would like to have one trial day at a market, may do so at no charge. The application must be submitted in the timeframe required. If the vendor chooses to participate after the trial day, they must submit the full fee prior to the next market date in order to do so. This will encourage new vendors to participate in our markets.

Proposed:

For Barber Shops, Hair Salons or Nail Salons that initiate their license after July 1, (within 6 months of the license renewal date), that establishment will be charged one-half (50%) of the annual fee.

Hotels/Motels:

Proposed:

Charge a late fee that aligns with their licensure fee, \$200-\$400.00 for applications that are submitted late. Administrative staff spends considerable time following up on hotels/motels that do not submit their applications and fees within the required period.

Public Pools:

Proposed:

For pools that operate year-round, charge a late fee that aligns with the license fee, \$150.00, for applications that are submitted late. Administrative staff spends considerable time following up on pools that do not submit their applications and fees within the required period.

Note: Seasonal pools do not open until their fee is paid and they have a satisfactory inspection.
